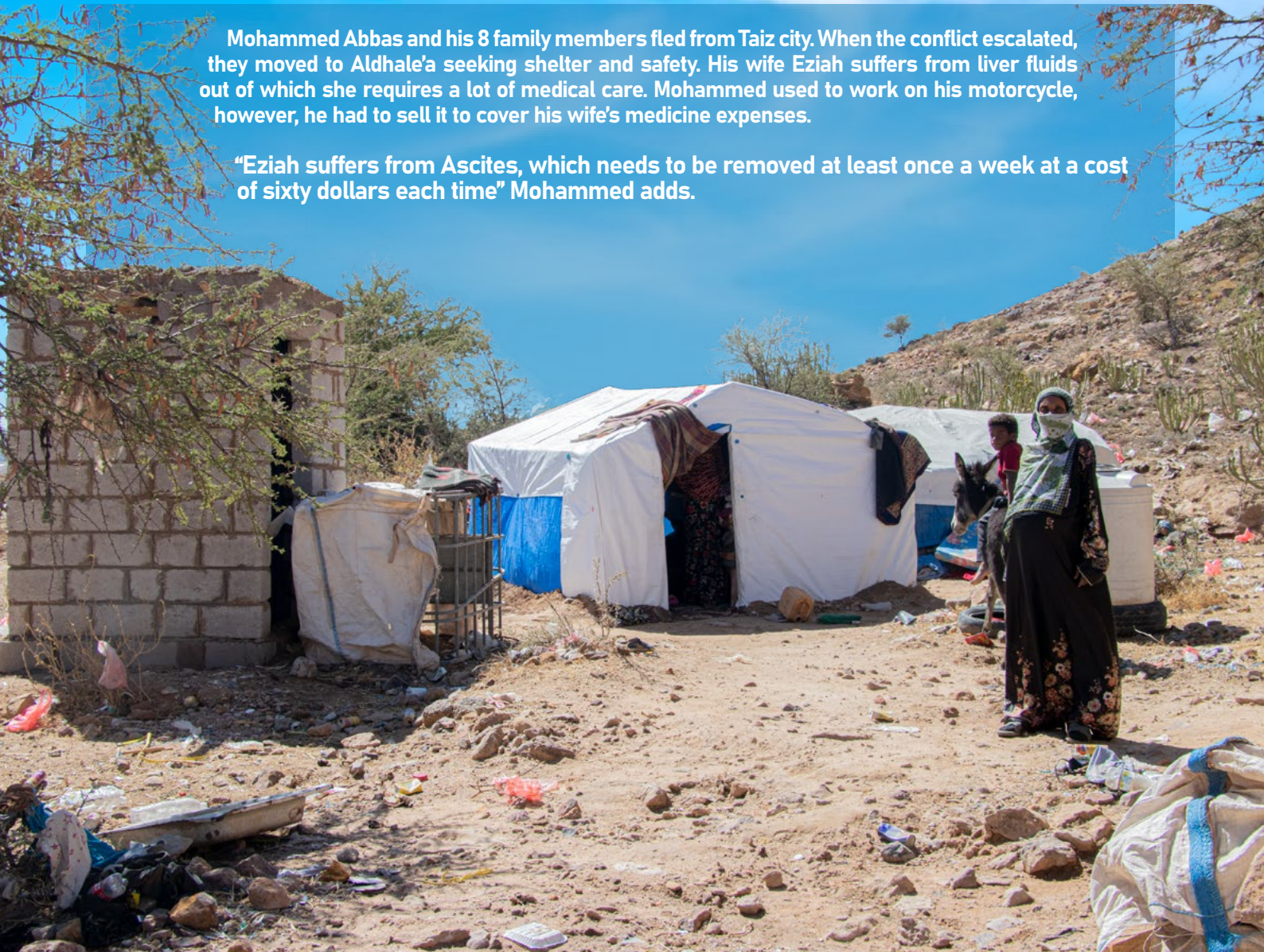

THE STRUGGLE FOR SURVIVAL

“The moment I saw my kids sleeping on mattresses and covered with blankets, I felt like I was reborn Compared to our previous situation and the suffering we were living through,” Mohammed Abbas said.

Mohammed Abbas and his 8 family members fled from Taiz city. When the conflict escalated, they moved to Aldhale'a seeking shelter and safety. His wife Eziah suffers from liver fluids out of which she requires a lot of medical care. Mohammed used to work on his motorcycle, however, he had to sell it to cover his wife's medicine expenses.

“Eziah suffers from Ascites, which needs to be removed at least once a week at a cost of sixty dollars each time” Mohammed adds.



Funded by (YHF), YFCA intervention in this district was by providing non-food items and emergency shelter kits for IDPs and the most vulnerable host communities. After registration and verification, YFCA team distributed 380 (NFIs), 180 (ESKs) to the most vulnerable IDPs cases at Juban, Damt, and Al-Hushaa districts in Al-Dhale'e Gov.

After they arrived at Aldhale'a, they built themselves a tiny house among the trees on a private propriety. This house is only one room and an outdoor kitchen but without a bathroom. Unfortunately, the landlord, out of fear that he may lose his land, began annoying them to move out of his land.

He continued "Despite it was difficult for us to live in our tiny house as eight family members, I wasn't able to do anything about it. Also, I have no capability neither to cover my family's basic needs nor to afford my wife's medication. Besides, the landowner kept annoying us leave his land, but we didn't have the capability to move out and rebuild a new house, so we got help from an association staff who went to the landowner and convinced him to let us stay."

Mohammed and his family received shelter and WASH assistance; tents, mattresses, blankets, and a latrine was built for them after convincing the landowner. These interventions were carried out under the project of Provision of Integrated WASH and Shelter assistance to IDPs and their most vulnerable hosting communities at Jehaf, Juban, Damt, and Al-Hushaa districts in Al-Dhale'a Gov. WASH and Shelter interventions provide a comprehensive response to 115708 beneficiaries (18516 IDPs and 97192 most vulnerable host communities) 18516 IDPs and 97192 most vulnerable host communities in the 4 targeted districts covering second line responses for newly accessible locations formed due to the recent clashing in Al-Dhale'a with focus on under-served IDPs within the 2nd line sector response to ensure that the IDPs have been in the minimum life's principles.
