CLEAN ENVIRONMENT... HEALTHY GENERATIONS

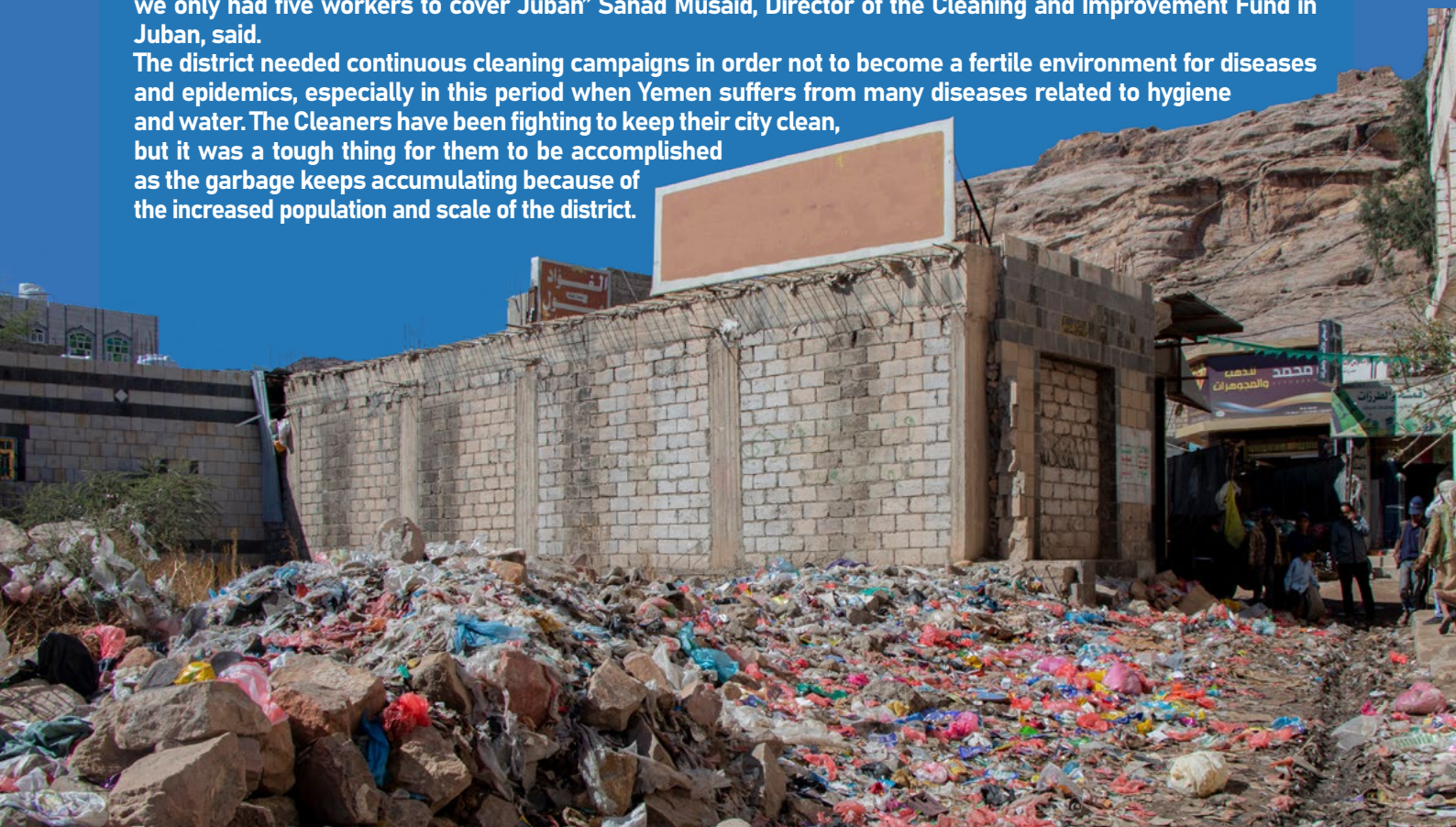
“The poor hygiene situation here in Juban is due to the low salaries and the inadequate number of workers” Ali bin Ali Muhammad, a cleaning supervisor in Juban District, said.

Many workers in Yemen haven't been receiving their salaries since the beginning of the conflict in Yemen, which led to the deterioration of the infrastructure and the lack of many necessities of life, in addition to the deterioration of the condition and workers continued to work without salaries.

Juban is one of the most populated areas in Aldhalea, with a population estimate of 59,857 in 2011 adding to hundreds of displaced families who chose Aldhalea as their new residence which led to the city suffering from a severe accumulation of garbage.

“We were not able to pay the salaries of the cleaning workers and the garbage was invading the District, as we only had five workers to cover Juban” Sanad Musaid, Director of the Cleaning and Improvement Fund in Juban, said.

The district needed continuous cleaning campaigns in order not to become a fertile environment for diseases and epidemics, especially in this period when Yemen suffers from many diseases related to hygiene and water. The Cleaners have been fighting to keep their city clean, but it was a tough thing for them to be accomplished as the garbage keeps accumulating because of the increased population and scale of the district.



Fortunately, the district had conducted an intense cleaning campaign with 20 new employees and equipment as part of YFCA Provision of Integrated WASH and Shelter assistance to IDPs and their most vulnerable hosting communities at Jehaf , Juban, Damt, and Al-Hushaa districts of Al-Dhale Gov, funded by YHF.

"It was difficult to cover the need and maintain the cleanliness of the area, but now, fortunately, the area has become cleaner and we are able to do our duty to the fullest after the increase in workers and the improvement of hygiene in the district."

Provision of Integrated WASH and Shelter assistance to IDPs and their most vulnerable hosting communities at Jehaf, Juban, Damt and Al-Hushaa Districts, Al-Dhale Gov.

The main objective of the project is to reduce the public health deterioration of the most vulnerable people in society, including internally displaced persons, who represent about 20% of the total target population by providing water and environmental sanitation interventions. YFCA Intervention is located in Al-Dhale Governorate in which a lot of families resident there are very poor and large proportion of them are IDPs. This area is not including in cleaning and improving fund plan of the governorate. The solid waste in this area is causing cholera, malaria and some interventions are needed to collect the previously dumped heaps of garbage in the area. Initial cleaning and collection of garbage have been performed manually following the devised action plan, new garbage collection points also been installed following the needs of the residents.

No solid waste management systems is taking in the place, however, the community collects the waste in an open area, which leads to spread diseases among the community members.
