AI Mahabesha Hospital / Hajjah Governorate Mrs. Razaki Al-Maazi / despair and reanimation

In Al Mahabisha city in Hajja Governorate, which the hospital is targeted by the Yemen Family Care Association (YFCA) within the framework of the minimum Health services package (MSP) project, which is implemented by the World Health Organization (WHO) and targeting of Hajjah and Hodeidah governorates.







To that hospital -according to the medical team- a woman of about 60 years of age arrived in a very critical

condition and was in deep coma and was unaware of GCS 08/15 with high fever and difficulty in breathing as a result of frequent vomiting during her coma and entry into the lungs, which worsened her condition as well as suffering from dryness of the middle class (MODERAT DEHYDRATION).

"My mother has long been sick and her diabetes has increased her health problems and her condition is worsening day by day," Mrs Razaki son said.

We live with my mother and five brothers in the village of Bani Ali at a distance of twelve kilometers from the city, and the road is very mountainous and rugged here, we were very afraid for my mother, But it was rescued by doctors in the hospital "



"I would like to thank everyone in the hospital, especially Dr. Jamil Al Amri. Thank you all for the care and attention you gave my mother until she recovered, thank God." The son adds happily. With regard to her health status Dr. Jamil al-Amri, a specialist doctor who works within the project, said: "When the woman arrived at the hospital, she was immediately admitted to the CPR room to take the





necessary emergency measures to save her life.

Then we were transferred her to the intensive Care unit.

They were given the necessary medicines, fluid compensation and Careful

monitoring of vital signs. The patient was improved only one day after intensive care, gradually regained consciousness and normal life, she had improved breathing clearly and was getting rid of the drought she was experiencing.

According to Dr. Jamil that Mrs. Razaqi came out of the hospital two days later, walking on her feet and in full health and well-being.

Meanwhile the Director of Mahabsha Hospital Dr.

Mohammed Al-Fagih



confirmed that since the

beginning of the project, the hospital has received many Critical Cases that come from around the City and the Villages surrounding it - especially since it is the only hospital in the area.
