

BEYOND SURVIVAL

SARA'S INSPIRING STORY

OF HOPE



Sara Mohammed Abdullah once enjoyed a stable childhood in Ibb Governorate. However, the war forced her family to flee to Al-Kardi Camp in Marib, where they now face significant hardships. Sara's father works long hours

in a small grocery shop, but his earnings are barely enough to sustain the family of five. With three children in school and one requiring ongoing medical care, everyday survival is a struggle.

Once a source of joy, education became a source of embarrassment for Sara. “I went to school without a uniform, bag, or notebooks,” she recalls. The lack of supplies made her feel inferior to her classmates, leading her to consider leaving school altogether. A turning point came when Yemen Family Care Association (YFCA) implemented the project “Provision of essential life-saving and life-sustaining

multisectoral support to the most vulnerable communities in Marib City and Khab Wa Ash Sha’f districts,” funded by Yemen Humanitarian Fund (YHF). As part of this initiative, YFCA distributed complete school kits, which included uniforms, bags, notebooks, and pens. This support equipped Sara with the necessary tools to learn with dignity.
