UNFPA-SUPPORTED PROJECT SAVED NAZRA AND HER BABY

In a remote area of Al-Qafr District in Yemen, a young woman named Nazra faced the daunting challenges of her first pregnancy. With limited access to healthcare services and financial constraints, Nazra's fears were compounded by the grim reality that a woman dies every two hours during childbirth in Yemen. However, thanks to the Obstetric Emergency Support Project implemented by Yemen Family Care Association (YFCA) and funded by UNFPA, Nazra's story took a positive turn, demonstrating the impact of comprehensive and integrated maternal healthcare services.

Despite the difficult circumstances surrounding her pregnancy, Nazra received crucial psychological and educational support from the Obstetric Emergency Support Project at Al-Rehab Center for Reproductive Health Services. This support helped alleviate her fears and prepared her for the journey ahead. The project's focus on providing comprehensive care to women ensured that Nazra's physical and mental well-being were addressed throughout her pregnancy.

As the time for childbirth approached, Nazra's fears resurfaced. However, she was fortunate to have YFCA project's medical team present at Al-Qafr Rural Hospital. Recognizing the situation's urgency, the medical team promptly provided the necessary services. Through thorough examinations, they discovered complications such as the presence of two uteruses, abnormal fetal positioning, severe bleeding, and an open uterus. The team sprang into action, ensuring Nazra's safety and making the needed efforts to help her make it through.
