

TRIUMPH OVER TRAUMA: GAMILAH'S JOURNEY TO HEALTH AND HOPE IN MARIB

In the heart of Marib city and Marib Al Wadi districts of Marib governorate, a story of resilience and transformation unfolds. Amidst the backdrop of ongoing conflict, Yemen Family Care Association (YFCA), with the support of the World Health Organization (WHO), launched a project aimed at providing essential trauma lifesaving healthcare services to those in need.

At the center of this story is Gamilah, a 26-year-old an IDP at Al-Gadidah compound. Gamilah's life took a drastic turn when she opted for an Implanon as a family planning method, which led to debilitating symptoms that severely impacted her daily life. She suffered from continuous vaginal bleeding and excruciating joint pain for a challenging six-month period, during which she had limited access to healthcare centers or hospitals.

In the subsequent visit to the compound, the mobile healthcare team witnessed Gamilah's remarkable transformation. The removal of the Implanon had not only alleviated her physical discomfort but also restored her overall well-being.
