# INTRO...



During March 19-April 23, 2018, OXFAM and partner organizations facilitated European have а Tour for selected Lobbying representatives of four local NGOs to advocate for local NGO leadership , strengthening the 'humanitariandevelopment-nexus' in the country and to share best practices and humanitarian response knowledge with a variety of stakeholders from the international community.

UN agencies, INGOs, NNGOs, government authorities and local Yemeni NGOs are all joining efforts to contain the humanitarian disaster in Yemen, however experience has shown that there are certain gaps in the humanitarian response because millions of people continue to be without assistance. Discussions with the various humanitarian partners and analysis of the situation pointed

out that Yemeni NGOs, who are very well positioned in terms of geographical proximity to the people in need, local knowledge, and ability to penetrate access restrictions, are facing multiple challenges in standing as equal partners with international agencies such as capacity limitations, language barriers, access to funds, lack of access to coordination and partnership platforms; thus it has become evident that strengthening humanitarian partnerships and supporting local humanitarian leadership was the only way for bridging the gaps in the humanitarian response and moving ahead. This gave rise to the need for understanding the capacities of the various humanitarian actors, existing inter-linkages between them and the roles they play.

OXFAM organized for the Yemeni delegation to visit key capitals/cities in Europe (Paris, Brussels and The Hague) in addition to facilitate participation in the High-level Pledging Conference for the humanitarian crisis in Yemen held in Geneva. Oxfam supported the delegation to meet with donors and officials in the four countries.

In Amman, the delegation arranged themselves couples of pertinent meetings with stakeholders and also attended one partnership workshop during their stay waiting for visas. The four local NGOs participated are: Yemen Family Care Association (YFCA) based in Sana'a, To Be Foundation (TBF) based in Aden, Wedyan Association for Society Development (WASD) based in Aden and Generations without Qat (GWQ) based in Taiz.

## I. AMMAN



The delegation has visited the Office of the Special Envoy of the Secretary-General to Yemen (OSESGY) in Amman, Jordan and met with the officers there to discuss matters of concern. The humanitarian-development-peace nexus programming was deeply discussed. The OSESGY team members were debriefed about the activities of each delegation member participated in the European Lobbying Tour.



Amman. Mar 30-31, 2018: The four-member delegation has managed to attend a two-day consultation meeting with Yemen Civil Society in Amman hosted by the Directorate-General for European Civil Protection and Humanitarian Aid Operations (DG ECHO) with the attendance of the representative of the EU ambassador to Yemen Antonia Calvo Puerta. During the workshop, a presentation was made on the main findings of the field survey conducted by EU in Yemen to have a clearer data about the capacity of CSOs in Yemen, overview of EU engagement with CSOs in Yemen and how to ensure a more regular and effective dialogue with CSOs. The workshop serves as a roadmap facility in

support of European Union Delegation (EUD) to Yemen.



## 2. GENEVA



Geneva. Apr 3, 2018: The United Nations and the Governments of Sweden and Switzerland convened a High-Level Pledging Event in Geneva for the Humanitarian Crisis in Yemen, to support the humanitarian response in Yemen and alleviate the suffering of the Yemeni people.

In the session finale of the event, international donors pledged more than US\$2 billion to support the delivery of urgently needed humanitarian aid to millions of people in Yemen.

The delegation participated in this event to voice out the genuine situation in Yemen and meet with donors, influencers and member states on the fringes of the event.





#### April 2018.

Three years of conflict and lawlessness in Yemen did bring the Yemeni hunger, diphtheria and cholera. Nearly three of four Yemenis rely on humanitarian aid to survive. The dire situation is deteriorating every day.

In March the UN Security Council made a strong plea for humanitarian access: Humanitarian support and peace must take the place of destruction. In the first week of April the UN and their international partners launched an international appeal for almost 3 billion US\$ for live saving assistance. At a pledging conference in Geneva 2 billion US\$ was raised.

Four representatives of NGOs from Yemen, that visited the pledging conference in Geneva, visited also Brussels and other European capitals to share their story with politicians and policy makers. During their tour, facilitated by Oxfam, they made time for a small expert meeting for KUNO, the platform for humanitarian knowledge exchange in the Netherlands.

Nabil Al-Kumain, Associate Executive Director Partnerships and Communications for the Yemen Family Care Association. Based in Sana'a.

The pledging conference was a great achievement, but there is a big but. We made clear in the conference that it is not all about money. We say clearly that there are no humanitarian solutions for these humanitarian problems. The solution is political; we need political interventions and peace talks between all fragments of Yemeni people.

During the pledging conference we emphasized the importance to start thinking about or to focus more upon the Humanitarian Development Nexus (HDN). What we do not want at the end of the day, is that three billion US\$ will be dumped into the country as short term 'hit and run' relief: distributing food baskets. We are asking for resilience. We don't see that as sustainability, but as stability. At the moment stability in programming is very necessary for the country.

The humanitarian actors at the pledge conference challenged our suggestions. They said this is not the time for Yemen for Development. We told them that it is indeed not about development, but it is about the humanitarian Development Nexus. So try to do both things: emergency relief and at resilience-based programming.

People in Yemen have adapted to minimum requirements of life. Take for example cooking on gas. A canister of 20 liter is close to 10-thousand Yemeni Real (almost 20 dollar) at the black market. Gas canisters are not available at the public fare anymore. A family can cook one week on 20 liter of gas. But the average salary of Yemeni people is approximately one-hundred dollar. So about one-fifth of you salary will go to one week gas for cooking. Buy the way: there are no salaries. Especially in the North. For almost two years now, civil servants are without salary. And there is no public electricity in the country since April 2015.

Jameem Abdulrageep, Director Wedyan Association for Society Development.
Based in Aden.

Aden is now the new transitional capital of Yemen. Three years ago the situation was very bad. Our work as NGOs was hard. Many NGOs had to close: buildings were destroyed, some of the workers were arrested, gthers were killed.

Now Aden is less unsafe than three years ago. There is a conflict between the Transitional Council and the Yemeni government We have also some security issues about ISIS and Al Qaida. But as humanitarian organizations we can access many arrears.

Many worries we are facing regards funding. Most of the international NGOs are based in Sana'a, not in Aden. Some have offices in Aden, but the staff has no authority. But we are in Aden, still fighting for people.
