The Call to Action on Protection from Gender-Based Violence in Emergencies is a global initiative of governments and donors, international organisations and non-governmental organisations. Its aim is to drive change and foster accountability from the humanitarian system to address GBV from the earliest phases of a crisis. The initiative was launched in 2013 by the United Kingdom and Sweden. The Call to Action is an unprecedented initiative that has the power to trigger the systemic changes that must be made in policy and practice to transform the humanitarian response to GBV.



Oct 2019/ Sa'adah and Al Dhale governorates, Yemen: To respond to the increasing healthcare needs, YFCA has equipped 7 targeted healthcare facilities in Sa'ada and Al Dhalee governorates with essential equipment including Scanner Ultrasound, delivery beds, sterilizers, Hematology analyzer, Centrifuge, Gynecological and Examination Couch, hospital beds, dressing set and instruments, Midwife kit, Laboratory microscope and other medical and furniture supplies.

Project: A three-year Apr 2017-Mar 2020 DFID-funded CIRAM project targeting seven districts; Monabbeh, Haydan, Saqyin and Kitaf districts of Sa'adah governorate and Damt, Juban and Al Azariq districts of Al Dhale governorate.












IN-HOUSE SHORT FILM UNVEILED

BACK FROM THE BRINK!

Faiza Ahmed, a 32-year-old woman, from Al-Muftah village, Al-Mahabeshah district of Haijah governorate, her health condition was deteriorated unexpectedly caused by a psychological trauma which made her unable to stand, walk or even sit without assistance. "My wife was a six-month pregnant: at first she had acute diarrhea leading to being extremely exhausted, then we quarreled for a domestic affair- she suddenly had fainted!" husband said.

For the destitution of Faiza's husband, she could not neither obtain the prescribed medicines nor carryout the needed health check-ups. "I was greatly depressed when looking at the eyes of my three boys and two girls thinking that they could lose their caring mother forever, the kids need care and affection which a father could not render for most of the time." husband added.

While the husband was in this whirlpool, one of his acquaintances visited him at house and advised to take his wife to Al Mahabeshah hospital which is a 90-minute driving distance from the village, the husband agreed especially because he knew that the hospital is WHO/YFCA supported and they might care of his wife well without incurring any costs.

"Faiza and husband reached to the hospital in the evening when her health condition was dramatically deteriorating, upon admission to the hospital, the health care team carried out a thorough check-up for hypertension, dehydration, heartbeat, respiratory system, abdominal distension, blood and potassium levels in addition to carrying out fetal ultrasound to check on the baby's physical development. The team placed her under intensive care during which she was given proper medication, iv bag of blood and an appropriate potassium dose." doctor reflected.

After 12 hours of care, FaiZa was able to stand on her feet for couple of minutes to hear the good news from the health professionals that her fetus is stable and showing signs of reactivity; she was given pregnancy tips how to stay healthy and thrive. She was discharged from hospital in three days and return home to find her kids bursting into tears of joy that their caring mom was pulled back from the brink.

Al Mahabeshah Inter-district Hospital is one of the supported healthcare facilities of the Minimum Service Package (MSP) project in Hajiah and Hudaydah Governorates-implemented and coordinated by YFCA and funded by WHO.
