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THE DISTRIBUTION OF RAPID RESPONSE MECHANISM KITS (RRMKS) TO NEWLY INTERNALLY DISPLACED PERSONS (IDPS)

Thursday, 30 September, 2021

Under the project of "The WASH and Humanitarian Food Assistance for IDPs, Host Communities, Returnees and Marginalized Groups," Yemen Family Care Association (YFCA), in coordination with the Executive Unit of IDPs in Shabwa Governorate, distributed 68 RRMKS for the third round within 72 hours to 45 families of newly IDPs, which was funded by German foreign Ministry (AA) and Diakonie Katastrophenhilfe (DKH). Due to the armed conflict on the border of Shabwa Governorate. YFCA rapidly responded to newly IDPs by distributing RRMKS, containing one

female dignity / transit kit and family basic hygiene kits, to 41 households in Bayhan district, and to 4 households in Aataq district in Shabwa Governorate. The response was conducted according to RRM protocol.



FRONT RUNNERS FOR DEVELOPMENT EFFORTS

July 1, 2021- Sana'a, Yemen

A productive meeting was convened between Yemen Family Care Association (YFCA) and the UNDP's Strengthening Institutional and Economic Resilience in Yemen (SIERY) project to probe the role of YFCA in such flagship development project and deliberate about the ongoing collective efforts of the donor and aid community to advocate for the Humanitarian-Development Nexus (HDN) in Yemen which YFCA has been a front runner.

SIERY project has been designed to buttress the resilience of local governance systems in Yemen to reinforce the resilience and

recovery of conflict-affected communities. The project is based on the assessment that in a context of protracted conflict and massive population movements across the country - which disproportionately affect women, children and youth - the resilience of local populations cannot depend solely on self-help or on foreign aid. It is also necessary that local authorities are able to more effectively fulfil their mission in terms of: (a) core functions; (b) basic service delivery, (c) emerging needs such as conflict resolution, humanitarian aid, disaster management, internally displaced people; and, (d) economic recovery.



335 COMMUNITY BASED WORKERS TRAINED

Sunday, 19th September, 2021.

YFCA conducted training of 335 from community based network (community based workers) in three districts (Salah , Almaudhafar and Alqaherah) Taiz city . This training aimed to provide nominated Community based workers from gocermental health offices -Taiz and districts health offices to train them on the identification process and the selection criteria of High risk indivdulas to COVID 19. the trainees will immediatly

targeted from door to door 25000 houtholdes along with other community based networks such as community leaders and community shielding frinds. The concept of sheilding to Highest risk individuels of COVID 19 is providing them with Knowlge and capacities. This prohject is funded by UNICEF and ECHO under thier plane of response to COVID 19 Panadamic through local implemnting partners YFCA.



INTEGRATED HEALTH OUTREACH ACTIVITIES

Sunday, 4th July , 2021.

Integrated health outreach activities continue to bring primary health services, including free medicines, immunization services, antenatal care consultations and awareness sessions, to the most vulnerable people who are living in the suburban villages of Rakhia and Al Abr districts and can't afford transportation cost to the supported health facilities.

During Apr and Jun 2021, 16 villages were visited by the assigned team, composed of midwives, vaccinators, and community health volunteers, and 1251

health services were reached by the targeted beneficiaries.

The two health facilities where YFCA through its team is helping to carry out Integrated health outreach activities are already supported through other means, including the provision of medicine, medical supplies, operational supports, monthly incentives to health workers and capacity building activities. YFCA is able to fully run these health facilities, thanks to support from Muslim Aid since January 2021



THE 8TH FOOD DISTRIBUTION CYCLE IN 2021

Wednesday, 14th September 2021

Within the General Food Assistance (GFD) project funded by World Food Program (WFP), and in coordination with the local authorities in Eastern Taiz, YFCA just finished the distribution of food baskets for the eighth round in 2021.

The distribution activity aims to provide food assistance for 163079 beneficiaries of 23297 vulnerable families in 4 districts in Eastern Taiz: Saber Al-Mawadem, Asand st Shamayatin, Maqbanah, and Mashra'a Wa Hadnan. It started on Aug 31th

ended on September 14 This food distribution activity is going to be launched again in other 4 districts in Western Taiz and 1 district in Al-Mahweet, with a total number of beneficiaries around fifty-one thousand

SUFFERING REDUCES ESPECIALLY WOMEN'S, AGONY

Thursday, 30 September, 2021

Within the activities of WASH YHF#17900 Project and under the framework of improving access of IDPs, host communities and most vulnerable individuals to safe drinking, domestic water and sanitation services in Qatabah, Al-Dhale Gov, where YFCA provides emergency temporary water trucking to many affected poor IDPs who have no enough access to either safe drinking water or domestic water, and they cannot afford the price of water trucks.

This intervention is highly needed to provide the minimum need (15-20 l/ person/per day). Under the supervision of YFCA team, water trucking was launched by the selected contractor who offers water trucks to move water from the source (wells, tanks) to the water points where the affected IDPs sites are; Western Sahda A, Western Sahda B, Naqil ALShim 1. The objective of this activity is to provide emergency temporary access to clean drinking water with a quantity of 20,000 Liter/ day for three months (90 Days) at the three targeted IDPs sites in Qa'tabah District, Al Dhalee Governorate.



This intervention helps lift some burdens on women and little girls who go far distances to bring water, leaving their responsibilities at home and school. The water trucking activity started on June 24th, 2021 and will finish on September 21st, 2021. Through this activity, 1124 individuals of IDPs access safe water every single day. Since the beginning of this activity, 1.660.000 liters of water has been provided to IDPs targeted camps.



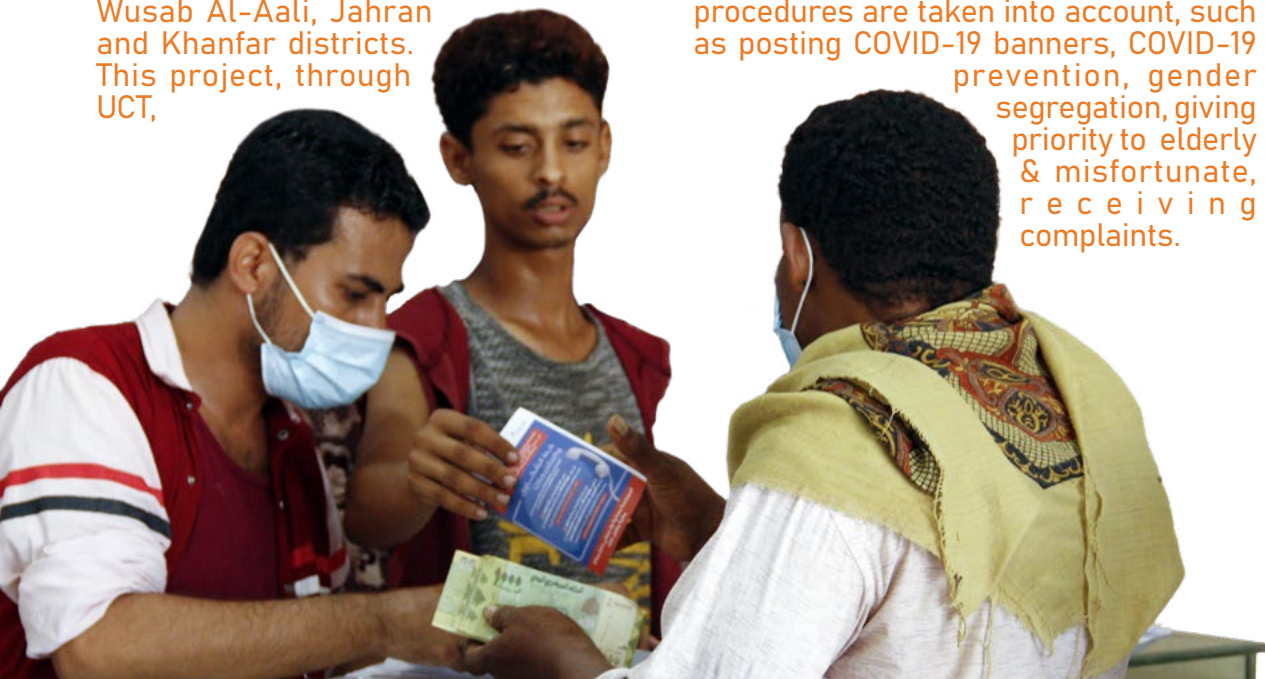
CASH DISTRIBUTION TO MITIGATE THE CONSEQUENCES OF COVID 19

Monday, 13th September, 2021.

The aim of the project is to assist people in acute humanitarian needs with a view to mitigating the risks of famine and consequences of COVID 19 in Yemen. Also, it aims to improve the food security status for most vulnerable IDPs in Wusab Al-Aali, Jahran and Khanfar districts. This project, through UCT,

will ensure the accessibility to most vulnerable groups by improving their food security situation, and by increasing their access to essential food and the consumption scores of the family members.

Cash distribution, arranged by FSP, is divided into 2 distribution points. Some procedures are taken into account, such as posting COVID-19 banners, COVID-19 prevention, gender segregation, giving priority to elderly & misfortunate, receiving complaints.

120 COMMUNITY HEALTH VOLUNTEERS TRAINED

Training package was launched for community volunteers working in the (BSFP) program in districts of Mahabsha and Mubin - Hajjah Governorate. The trainings included 120 volunteers; 60 volunteers in both of Al-Mahabesha and Mubin districts. These trainings aim to enhance the capability of the participants in providing preventive nutritional services that reduce the



spread of malnutrition among pregnant and lactating mothers, and children under two years of age.
