DISTRIBUTION OF SHIELDING KITS IN TAIZ

12, December, 2021

YFCA started conducting distribution of shielding kits to 8,330 beneficiaries in Al Qahirah-Taiz, these Shielding Kits were funded from UNICEF and ECHO in coordination with GHO-Taiz, The community shielding concept is designed to enable shielding of high-risk individuals to COVID 19 with Knowledge and means. One of these means is shielding Kits which are designed to enable high-risk individuals and their families to protect themselves from being infected with COVID 19 as well as High-risk individuals will have the ability to enable shielding and ensure infection prevention control at the household level. shielding kits distribution conducted from 12-17 December 2021.

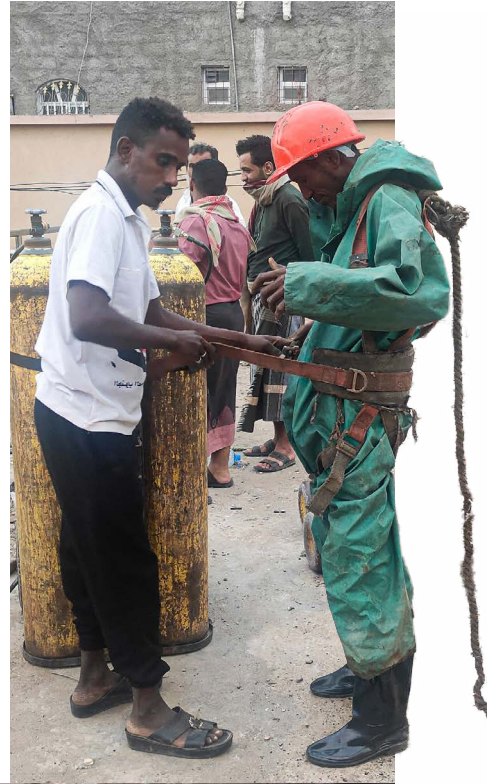

Nov 03, 2021- Sana'a/Amman/Washington

A cloud meeting convened between the YFCA and international program team of the World Bank Group in Sana'a, Amman and Washington led by Artavazd Hakobyan, the team leader of the newly 2021-2025 Yemen Food Security Response and Resilience Project (FSRRP); deliberations pivoted on

potential teaming up with the UNDP, WFP, FAO (the fund's major recipients) to deliver on the focused themes of Social Protection, Agriculture, Fishing & Frostery and Livestock in the targeted spots of Al Jawf, Hajjah, Hodaydah, Dhamar, Al Baidha, Abyan, Taiz, and Lahj.



CONSTRUCTION OF HANDWASHING POINTS

7, December, 2021

YFCA started construction of handwashing points in Aden (6 in Alshikh Othman, 6 in Dar Sa'ad, and 5 in Alburigah), these handwashing points Kits were funded from UNICEF and ECHO in coordination with LWSC-Aden, The WASH component in community shielding is designed to enable shielding of high-risk individuals to COVID 19 with Knowledge and means. One of these means is Handwashing points which are designed to enable high-risk individuals and their families to protect themselves from being infected with COVID 19 as well as ensure of applying infection prevention control in targeted districts within community-level.

YFCA completed the distribution of nutrition commodities in Dhamar governorate. 14690 children under 2 years old and 9573 pregnant and lactating women were reach through the prevention interventions within Promotion of Preventive and Lifesaving Nutrition Intervention project.

YFCA NOMINATED FOR THE CaLP's TECHNIAL ADVISORY GROUP

During the fourth quarter of 2021, YFCA has been proudly nominated by the board of directors of the Cash Learning Partnership (CaLP) UK to be an active member of the Technical Advisory Group (TAG).

The TAG helps shape and steer the CaLP network's technical and policy priorities within the overall strategic vision for the network. All TAG Representatives are from CaLP member organizations or are independent members of CaLP. The TAG Proposes, leads and supports thematic areas of work across

the network, supported by working groups. Reviews and/or endorses key technical and policy outputs from network members, ensuring complementarities with related member initiatives. Identifies key issues where collective action and advocacy across the network is needed, and supports this. Act as champions for the CaLP network, helping to connect members, disseminate work and create opportunities for engagement. The TAG is comprised of between 20 and 30 individual Representatives.



Bilateral Field Visit

19-24/10/2021

As part of a monitoring visit for the UNFPA-funded emergency obstetric project, Mr. Qarik Hirabitan, Deputy Representative of UNFPA in Yemen, along with his UNFPA colleagues, and Mr. Jalal Ghollah, Ibb area Manager - Representative of YFCA and his team, visited Ibb governorate to discuss UNFPA's intervention. Furthermore, they visited Naser Hospital in the Al Mashanah district of Ibb, Al Odain Hospital in the Al Odain district of Ibb, and Damt Health Center in the Al Dhale'a district to observe the ongoing activities and monitoring the quality of services provided in the targeted HFs. These visits aim to identify medical services that need to be strengthened and figure out any gaps and challenges that may arise.



distribution of RH medicines & Medical supplies

As part of the ongoing UNFPA-funded emergency obstetric project and in the third cycle, 21 health facilities in four governorates (Alhudydah - Ibb - Sada'a - Aldhala'a) have received essential reproductive health medicines, medical supplies, and commodities to enhance the functionality of the supported health facilities in targeted districts.



Nearly **5000** newborns have been safely born

16/10/2021

YFCA/UNFPA ongoing RH project has supported 22 Health facilities; the support focuses on obstetric emergencies, which mainly provide reproductive health services and other primary health services. In the third quarter of 2021, the overall number of services reached by targeted communities in all targeted areas is 117,579.

7979 of the services were family planning services, and 15026, 11442, 4619, 11189, 67324 were antenatal care, deliveries, postnatal care, other reproductive health, and general medical consultations services respectively.

YFCA influence changed people's behavior towards the solid waste management!

Within YHF#17900 Project, which is a comprehensive project of Water and Sanitation for IDPs and Hosting Communities in Marib city, Marib governorate, Qatabah and Alhusha, Aldhale'e governorate, funded by Yemen Humanitarian Fund (YHF) and implemented by Yemeni Family Care Association (YFCA) and under the framework of durable

provision, rehabilitation and maintenance of water supplying systems for affected population, cleaning campaigns are conducted in Qa'tabah at IDP sites and the city streets, and neighborhoods.

YFCA Intervention is located in Qa'tabah district, Al-Dhalee Governorate in which a lot of residents are very poor and a large proportion of them are IDPs. people in this



area don't have enough consideration of the importance of hygiene, and due to the lack of solid waste management systems in the place, the community collects the waste in an open area which leads to spread diseases among the community members such as cholera, malaria for both host community and IDPs. So, YFCA pushed to raise the awareness of people around hygiene. Besides, the cleaning campaigns intervention which is highly needed to collect the previously dumped heaps of garbage in the area helped people to stay healthy. Initial cleaning and collection of garbage has been performed manually following the devised action plan, and new garbage collection points have also installed following the needs of the residents.

This activity aims to implement 21 cleaning campaigns in Qa'tabah District, Al Dhalee Governorate, at a rate of three to four campaigns per month by 20 cleaners to create a clean environment through removing the accumulated waste that may cause diseases outbreak in the targeted area. Moreover, twelve campaigns has been fulfilled till the end of September.

The hygiene cleaning campaigns activity was launched with the participation of the director of the district and the Director of the Cleaning and Improvement Fund with the observation of YFCA team. Moreover, YFCA provided equipment and supplies to the cleaning fund to manage solid and liquid waste to establishing a long-term sustainable environmental system.



Providing safe, appropriate shelter and essential household items

Improving life outcomes & food security

Where some families may pull their children out of school before they gain important skills that would help them produce higher revenues in the future, Cash transfers can potentially play an important role to smooth consumption by stabilizing household income.

Improving the accessibility through UCT helps the most vulnerable groups in bridging the gap in their food security situation and increase their access to essential food and improve the consumption scores of family members.

Cash transfers has positive impacts in food consumption in many different ways. Families may use additional income to improve the quantity, quality and the variety of the food they consume.

It prevents or mitigate negative responses to food insecurity, such as eating unhealthy food, skipping meals, etc..

With the continuation of cash transfer, beneficiaries were able to secure their needs of food and Increased their food diversity by purchasing different type of food.



Cash Distribution (Round 2)

30-9- 2021

The aim of the project is to assist people in acute humanitarian needs with a view to mitigate the risks of famine and negative consequences of COVID 19 in Yemen. as well as, to improve the accessibility to food for the most vulnerable IDPs in Wusab Al Aali, Jahran and Khanfar districts towards improving their food security status. In short, improving the accessibility will be through UCT that will help the most vulnerable groups in bridging the gap in their food security situation and increase their access to essential food and improve the consumption scores of family members.

- * Cash distribution was arranged through FSP, divided into 2 distributions points.
- * Posting the Banners, Covid posters, Complaint board, count your money
- * COVID-19 Prevention was taken into consideration.
- * Gender Segregation.
- * Making priority for elderly & misfortunate.

Open defecation is an affront to the dignity and health of girls and women, especially girls and women, and potentially exposes them to further sexual exploitation and threatens their personal safety as well as it poses a threat to their health and it can pollute the environment and cause health problems and diseases.

Therefore, in coordination with local authorities and Community Committees (CC), Yemen Family Care Association (YFCA) is starting to construct family latrines to 150 households by providing the beneficiaries with tools, materials and labours support in two targeted districts (Markha Al-Sufla and Jardan) of Shabwah Governorate, within the project of WASH and humanitarian food assistance for IDPs, host communities, returnees and marginalized groups in six districts of Shabwah Governorate-Yemen, which is funded by German Foreign Ministry (AA) in partnership with Diakonie Katastrophenhilfe (DKH) (German Humanitarian Assistance Organization).



This activity is aimed to:

- Support the most vulnerable and affected people in the targeted districts with the construction of family latrines to improve their sanitation services.
- Protecting society from pollution and diseases that arise due to open defecation, as well as defecation in semi dilapidated latrine.
- Providing complete health and personal protection for families who are unable to build a latrine especially for women.

Water Quality Surveillance

Aug – Nov/ 2021

“Since water is the essence of life, YFCA is working hard in all ways so as to protect this natural source from deterioration and keep Yemeni people safe from water-borne diseases that are widely spread out nowadays such as cholera which has killed many people especially women and children.

Therefore, Yemen Family Care Association (YFCA) was conducting Water Quality Surveillance in four targeted districts (Ataq, Markha Al-Sufra, Nisab and Jarda) of Shabwah Governorate, within the project of WASH and humanitarian food assistance for IDPs, host communities, returnees and marginalized groups in six districts of Shabwah Governorate-Yemen, which is funded by German Foreign Ministry (AA) in partnership with Diakonie Katastrophenhilfe (DKH) (German Humanitarian Assistance Organization).

Moreover, during October and November/2021, YFCA in cooperation and in coordination with General Authority for Rural Water and Sanitation Project (GARWASP), National Water Sanitation Authority (NWSA) and health offices in

Shabwah Governorate was testing 63 samples at HHs level through trained water quality volunteers (WQVs) by using water tester devices which measure the TDS, E.C, PH, FRC, Salinity, Temperature, and taking 10 water samples from different community water resources in four targeted districts and then the samples are sending to the lab for making physical, chemical, and biological analysis in order to evaluate the quality of water at those water assets and suggest the suitable processing methods.

This activity is aimed to:

- Developing access to safe drinking water for the people in the targeted districts.
- Awareness to the community, especially on using clean water, the proper methods of transporting and preserving water, the importance of water purification and sterilization, and avoiding negative behaviors
- Effective contribution to reducing the spread of water-related epidemics and diseases.”
